3. Objective(s): <u>Statewide Participant Objectives:</u> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Check-in on VHF and/or HF (voice) nets. 2. Winlink Stations: Transmit the Winlink Check-in form to your County simulated EOC or local planning team station. (Hawaii County send to WH6DVI) 3. Use your "inject" to phrase messages or complete the form. Essential Elements of Information only. 4. Determine priority & best mode of delivery. 5. Transmit messages in an accurate and timely way via any bands, modes, and appropriate techniques. 6. Use best practices in emergency communications. (Use break tags, pro-words, etc.) 7. HF Operators: Transmit band conditions to other participants. Help others move traffic forward. 8. Accurately log message traffic on your ICS-309 log sheet. 9. Obtain confirmation of message receipt. (Hub/Relay stations report success or failure to spokes.) 10. Operate on Emergency Power, if able. 11. Check out of the voice nets before leaving the frequency. Check back in when returning. 12. Winlink Stations: Transmit the Check-out form before noon, or prior to shutting down your station. 																
4. Operational Period Command Emphasis: Storm Progresses from Kauai through the state to Hawaii County. 09:00-11:00 HST. Storm Impacting Kauai County. (Situation Manual, Ground Truth, Pg 12) 09:30-11:30 HST. Storm Impacting Oahu & Maui. (Situation Manual, Ground Truth, Pg 13-15) 10:00-12:00 HST. Storm Impacting Hawaii Co. (Situation manual, ground truth, Pg 16-17) Work together within and between islands. Form ad-hoc relay paths as needed on any FCC Part 97 authorized band or mode. HF operators listen for others and provide relay to their EOC if possible. Take relay traffic if you are confident you can push it to its destination.
